Abstract

The abstract should provide a summary of the paper. It should start one line after the authors' details. The abstract should range between 200 and 300 words, without equations, references, and in one paragraph. It should include the purpose of the study, methods, major results, major conclusion, and key recommendations specifying the target audience to whom recommendations are addressed.

1. INTRODUCTION

In the introduction, situate the study in the broad context of the literature and provide justification for the importance of the study. Since the conference is about cooperative societies and innovative entrepreneurs, we do not expect a full review of the literature on cooperatives or innovative entrepreneurs. Instead of reviewing the literature on issues such as the history, meaning, principles and values of cooperatives, it is recommended to only present a high-level synthesis of what is relevant to your study to avoid redundancy in the inclusion of the same issues across several manuscripts. Focus on providing a review of current and topical literature in the field. The section should conclude with the main aim of the manuscript and end with key conclusions from the study.

2. METHODS

In this section, describe the methods employed in the study. It is not expected to review the literature on the research method. The focus should be on the description of the steps taken in implementing the study, challenges experienced, lessons learnt and limitations (if any).

3. RESULTS

The results section should be divided into sub-headings based on key findings from the study. This section may be divided into subheadings. It should provide a concise and precise description of the experimental results, their interpretation, as well as the experimental conclusions that can be drawn.

Headings of tables must appear at the top of the table while figure headings must appear below the figures. Figures and tables should appear in the main chapter as close as possible to first mention. Tables must be inserted as texts, not as image. Author(s) must ensure that they have permission to use all third-party copyrighted materials. Failure to do this will delay the publication process. The editors reserve the right to request that authors remove materials without copyright permission. All figures and tables should be cited in the main text as Figure 1, Table 1, etc.

5. CONCLUSIONS

Briefly write the conclusions of your study, preferably in the form of paragraphs. At the end of your conclusion, briefly describe managerial and policy implications of your work.
